Updates for Term 4

Better environment for learning and work

I am pleased to announce that the renovation of our General Office has been completed, and our administrative team has moved back to Level 1.

Thank you for your patience during this period of transition. Our school is committed to providing a more conducive learning environment for our staff and students. I am also pleased to share that both our Science laboratories have been renovated and we have added two new special rooms, the EdTech room and IXORA room, to support more student-centric learning experiences.

It is worth mentioning that we have engaged our students in the design of the IXORA room and upcoming library and canteen projects. We believe in giving our students a voice in designing new learning spaces that serve their needs. Our students' involvement in working with industry partners such as architects and designers has attracted media attention, and we will be featured online this Sunday and in print on Monday's Straits Times. Our school hall is now air-conditioned to provide our students with a more conducive environment during school events. There are more upcoming major renovation projects, starting with the installation of turnstile gates, retiling of the canteen, renovation of the school hardcourt, replacement of the outdoor playground, and construction of a new Care Hub which comprises the Student Services Hub with free-access areas to support students' self-directed learning this year.
