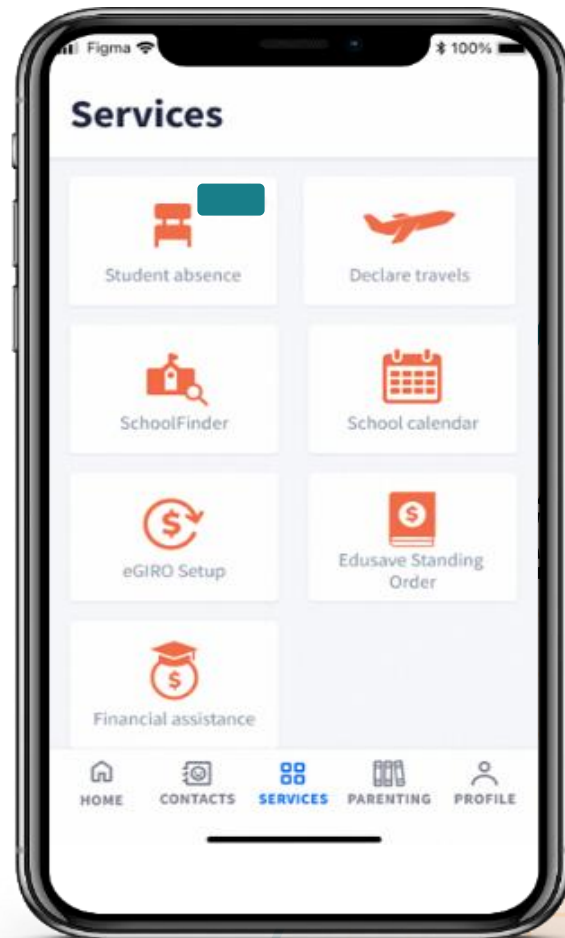

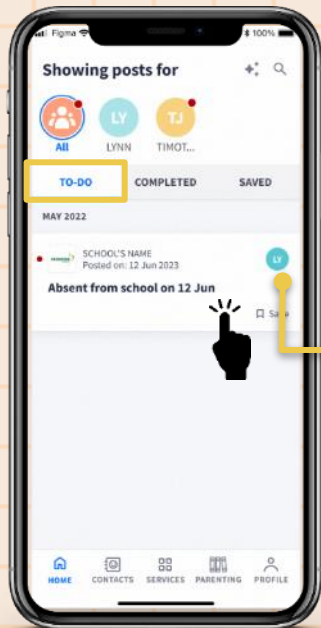

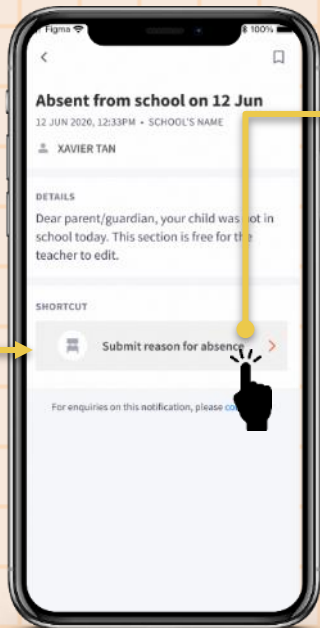


Parent's PG Notification Flow for student absence

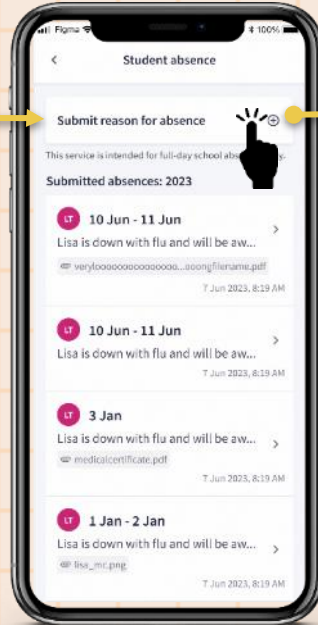
Parents can now submit the reasons for absence when they are notified of their child's absence on their Parents Gateway app.



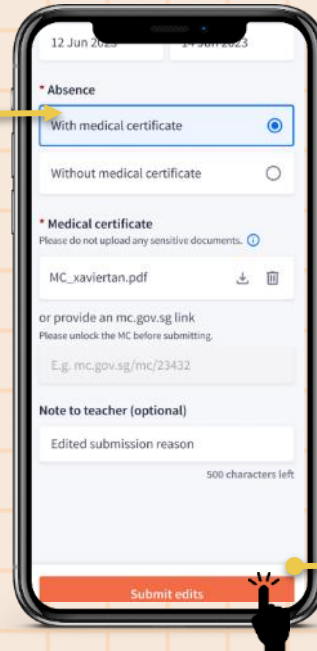
Parents access PG App: To-Do Page



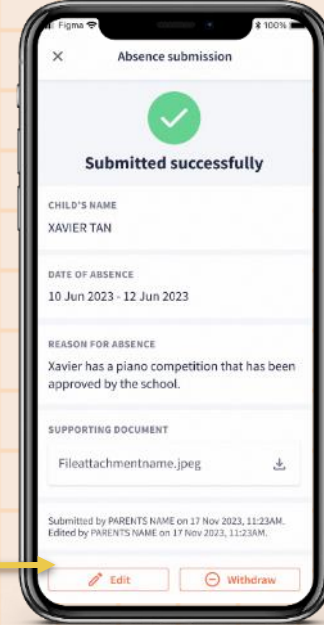
Parent clicks and reads announcement

Parent fills in the reason for absence

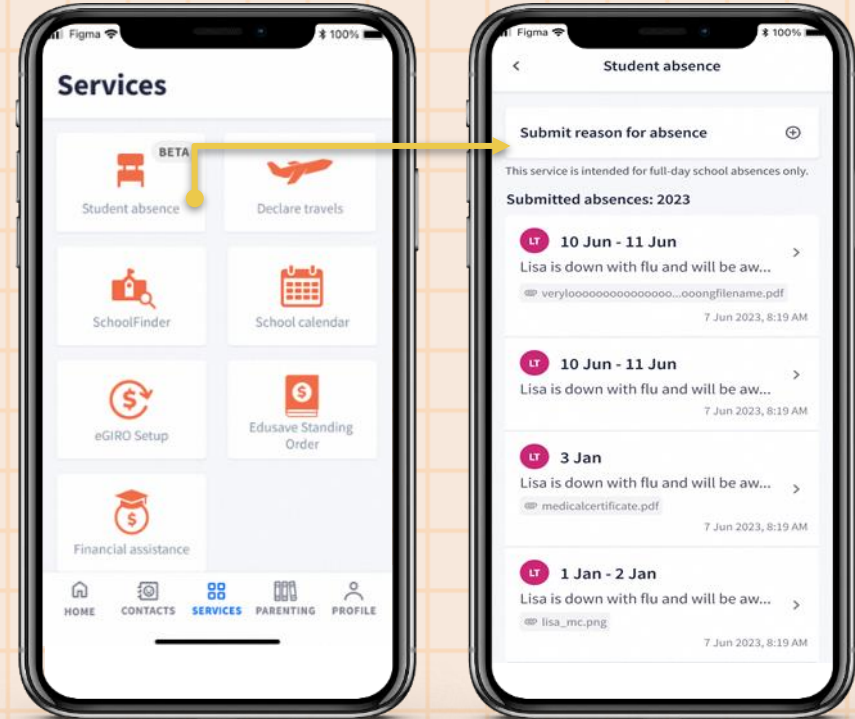

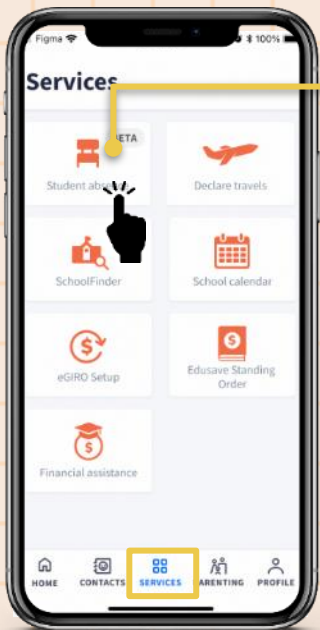
*When school is onboard both SC Mobile and PG app

- Submitted documents and information will be deleted at the end of each academic year (16th December).

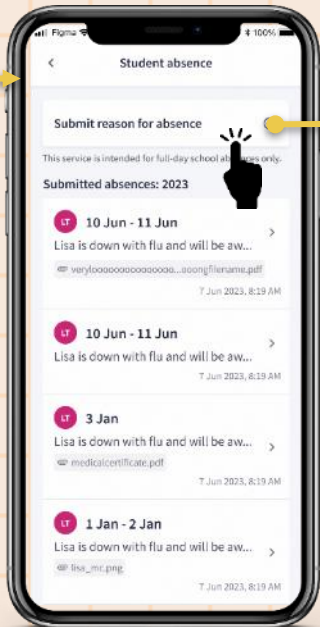


Parent's PG self-initiated submission for student absence

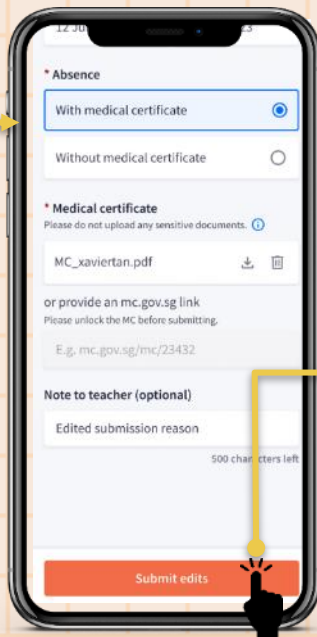
Parents can submit the reasons for student absence before, after or on the date of absence via PG app.



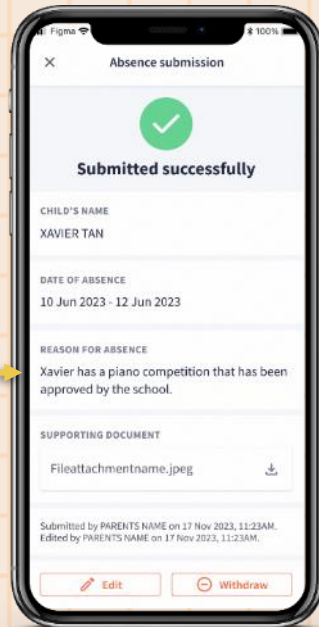
Parents access PG App: Services Page

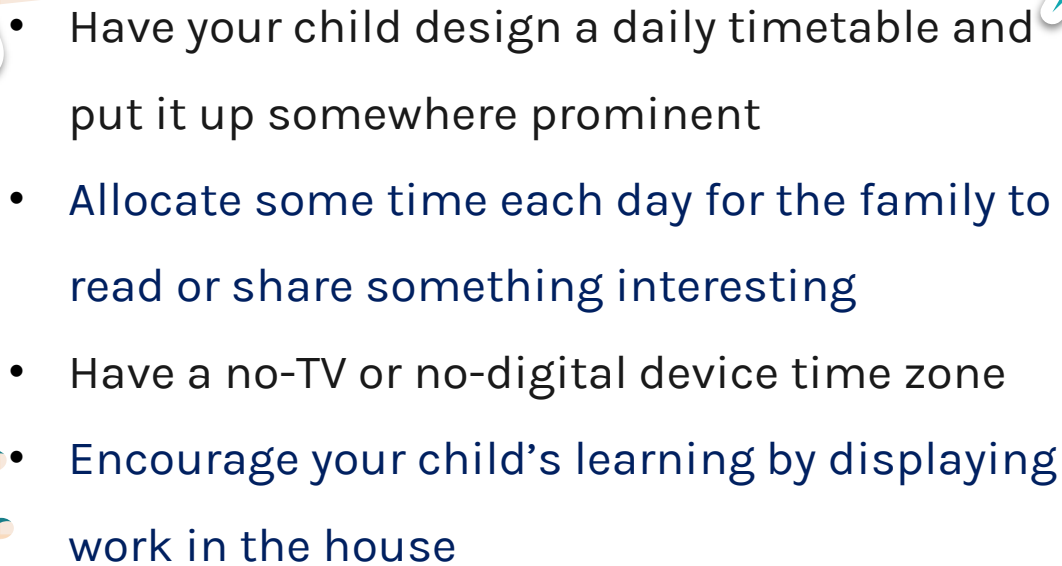

 - Affirm their efforts

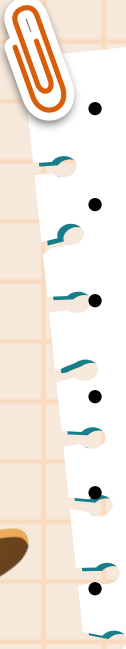

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Inculcating Values

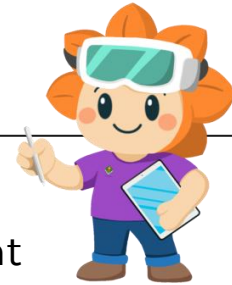
- 
- Instill sense of responsibility and resilience
 - Remind them to pack their school bags the night before to help them develop good discipline and habits in taking ownership
 - Check in with them if they have completed their assignment for the day



School- Home Partnership



Homework Policy



- Reinforces and consolidate learning in the classroom, allowing students to practise and apply the new skills and knowledge learnt
- Develop good study habits such as time management and self-discipline to become self-directed learners
- Provides parents with insights into their child's learning, creates opportunities for meaningful engagement with child's education
- Helps teachers to assess students' understanding and progress and give timely feedback and support

Excessive Homework can have adverse impact on students' holistic development and can also negatively affect their motivation for learning.

Recommended guideline: Less than 5 hours per week, approx. 30 min a day



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Homework Policy

Examples of homework	Examples of tasks done by students
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pen and paper assignments	Self-Directed Learning (SDL) activities, e.g. self-revision for exams and tests
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• e-learning assignments (e.g. SLS lessons, Koobits)	Student-initiated learning (SIL) as part of HBL days
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Flipped classroom learning (e.g. watching videos on SLS, research before lessons)	Student-initiated consultations with teachers

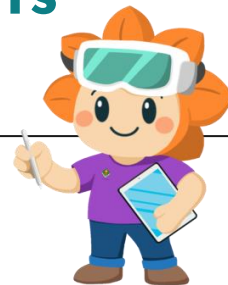
Teachers will write the homework on the board. Students will learn to take note of the homework in their school diary.





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Roles and Responsibilities of students when managing homework



- Understand the purpose of homework and what is expected;
- Keep track of instructions and deadlines;
- Manage their time to complete homework on time;
- Do their best when completing homework;
- Review and learn from teachers' feedback and ask for help when needed.
- Set time for self-directed learning, to consolidate what they have learnt during term time and pursue co-curricular interests at their own pace, as part of holistic development when homework is not assigned during March and September holidays



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Roles and Responsibilities of parents/guardians when supporting homework practices

Provide a quiet, comfortable space for homework and establish a regular homework routine to support studying and completing homework;

Guide and support their child's learning;

Encourage good study habits and attitudes;

Be aware of the pressures from school and other activities, and help their child manage time; and

Work together with teachers and the school to support their child's learning and development.
